Article 1

To assist students from low- and middle-income households at our university in successfully completing their studies and to provide necessary financial support for their education, these measures are formulated in accordance with the Ministry of Education's "Assistance Program for Disadvantaged Students in Higher Education Institutions."

Article 2

Eligibility for application includes citizens of the Republic of China with registered household registration, enrolled students with academic status at our university (excluding extended studies and in-service master's programs). Eligible students must not have any of the following conditions:

1. For undergraduate students, the annual household income exceeds NT\$900,000; for master's and doctoral students, the annual household income exceeds NT\$700,000, based on the latest comprehensive household income verified by the tax authorities.
2. The total interest income of the household exceeds NT\$20,000, based on the latest annual household interest income verified by the tax authorities. However, if the interest income is from preferential savings and the principal amount does not exceed NT\$1,000,000, relevant supporting documents can be submitted for school verification and record-keeping.
3. The total value of real estate owned by the household exceeds NT\$6,500,000, based on the comprehensive household property value verified by the Financial Information Center of the Ministry of Finance each year.

4. The average academic performance of the previous semester is below 60 points (excluding new students and transfer students). If a student has no academic record due to thesis writing in the previous semester, the latest semester academic performance can be used.

Article 3

The scope of subsidies includes tuition, miscellaneous fees, and credit fees, excluding fees for extended study periods, retakes, and supplementary courses. The subsidy standards and amounts are as follows:

1. Those who meet the requirements of Article 2 and have not received any government public fee reductions can apply. The annual subsidy amount per person is based on the announcement by the Ministry of Education.
2. This scholarship only provides subsidies for tuition and miscellaneous fees for students from low- and middle-income households. For living subsidies, students can apply for work-study scholarships or living scholarships.
3. For students who transfer, suspend, withdraw, are expelled, or other situations, the scholarship issuance is as follows:
 1. If a student does not complete the previous semester's studies (e.g., suspends, withdraws, or is expelled) and does not return to school in the following semester, the scholarship will not be issued. If a student suspends studies but returns and completes the studies in the following semester, half of the subsidy amount will be issued. If a student does not complete the following semester's studies, the issued scholarship will not be recovered, but when returning or re-enrolling, the scholarship for that academic year will not be reissued.
 2. If a student completes the previous semester's studies and transfers to a new school in the following semester, the new school will issue the scholarship.
 3. If a student completes the previous semester's studies and does not continue schooling in the following semester, half of the subsidy amount will be issued.
 4. If a student completes the previous semester's studies and applies for other subsidies in the following semester, half of the subsidy amount will be issued.

Article 4

Required documents: an original household registration transcript or a photocopy of the new household registration book (including the remark column, separate submissions are required for different households), the transcript of the previous academic year, and a photocopy of the student ID card, all within the last three months.

Article 5

Application process:

1. The scholarship is processed once each academic year in the first semester. Applications must be submitted within the deadline specified by the Life Guidance Section of the Student Affairs Office. Late submissions will not be accepted.
2. Students who meet the application criteria must complete the online application within the specified time, print the application form, and submit it along with the required documents to the Life Guidance Section of the Student Affairs Office.

Article 6

Students who have applied for tuition reductions based on various tuition reduction methods in the current academic year, or have received other government subsidies or tuition reduction benefits of similar nature, can only choose one method and cannot apply for multiple subsidies simultaneously.

Article 7

Subsidy amounts:

1. Undergraduate students: divided into two levels, with subsidy amounts of NT\$15,000 or NT\$20,000.
2. Master's and doctoral students: divided into five levels, with subsidy amounts ranging from NT\$12,000 to NT\$35,000.

Article 8

Matters not covered by these measures are subject to the latest "Assistance Program for Disadvantaged Students in Higher Education Institutions" and "Guidelines for Protecting the Rights and Interests of Scholarship and Assistance Students in Colleges and Universities" promulgated by the Ministry of Education.

Article 9

The funding source for this scholarship is the special fund for tuition subsidies from the annual tuition fees.

Article 10

These measures shall be implemented after being approved by the Student Affairs Meeting. The same applies to any amendments.
