

Yuan Ze University Financial Aid for Living Expenses Regulations

Ratified at the 2nd Student Affair Committee Meeting on 16 January 2008

- Article 1 The Regulations are promulgated in accordance with the “Ministry of Education's Financial Aid Program for Disadvantaged Students in Colleges and Universities”, “Guidelines for Ensuring the Rights and Interests of Scholarship Recipients in Colleges and Higher Education Institutions”, which provides assistance to financially disadvantaged students in the University. Supported students are guided to engage in non-remunerated life service learning to expand their field of study and foster independence and autonomy.
- Article 2 The order of awarding of financial aid for living expenses is to current students who meet the qualifications of grants of disadvantaged students, tuition and miscellaneous fee exemptions and other government aid measures.
- Article 3 Students who meet the application qualifications can apply to each unit of the University. The number of students is determined according to the annual budget of each unit.
- Article 4 Students who receive the financial aid for living expenses (hereinafter referred to as scholarship students) can be arranged by the school to provide living service learning. The service contents and methods are as follows,
1. Planned public Service Learning activities based on the "Higher Education Service Learning Program" and "Guidelines for Ensuring the Rights and Interests of Scholarship Recipients in Colleges and Higher Education Institutions." The hours of service and the grant amount are not on a quid pro quo basis.
 2. With service responsibilities: Arrange scholarship students to participate in activities aimed at serving the school for the purpose of giving back. The service hours shall be capped at 8 hours per week and no more than 30 hours per month.

3. If the student's Outstanding performance in service learning in the previous academic year, or GPA in the most recent semester is among the top 30% in their department, the student's service learning hours may be reduced with the consent of the service unit.

Article 5 Each unit should assess the service learning performance of scholarship students as a reference for the next issuance of financial aid for living expenses and reduction of service hours.

Article 6 Financial aid for living expenses are issued by each unit, with the amount of NT\$6,000 or more per student per month subject to the annual budget. The amount of the living expenses should not be different due to differences in service learning hours. For students who receive a living expenses of more than NT\$3,000 but less than NT\$6,000 per month per student, the unit shall not arrange for living service learning.

Article 7 Matters not covered in these measures shall be based on the latest promulgations of the “Ministry of Education's Financial Aid Program for Disadvantaged Students in Colleges and Universities”, and the “Guidelines for Ensuring the Rights and Interests of Scholarship Recipients in Colleges and Higher Education Institutions” issued by the Ministry of Education.

Article 8 After approval from the Student Affair Committee Meeting, these regulations will become effective and any amendments will follow the same process.
